#### <u>PRACTICE STATS FOR 2020 –</u> <u>QUARTER BY QUARTER</u>

In unusual years like 2020, it is helpful to get a perspective on how you did compared to others. The statistics listed below are

*Bill Rossi* based on our "Dental Dow," which is a sample of mature upper Midwest practices.

#### First Quarter of 2020:

In the first quarter, production was down about 9% and collections were about even with the first quarter of 2019.

#### First Half of 2020:

At of the end of June, practice production was down 30% and collections were down 20%.

#### **<u>Third Quarter 2020 compared to Third</u> Quarter 2019**:

Most practices rebounded pretty strongly in the third quarter. About 20% of our sample practices had all-time record months in June or July. In the <u>third quarter of</u> 2020, production was up 10% and collections were up 5% compared to the <u>third quarter of 2019</u>.

<u>Year to date</u> though, through the third quarter, production and collections were <u>down</u> 17%.

#### Rebound - The Last Half of 2020:

The last half of 2020 showed practice production up about 4% and collections up 2% compared to 2019's averages. So, in the second half of the year, most practices had attained or exceeded somewhat the same level they were at in 2019.

#### 2020 Wrapped Up:

**Overall, production and collections were down about 12% for the year.** However, patient flow was down more than that – 18%. New patients were down 20%. Production per patient went up, but most practices had a couple months' worth of "missed" Continuing Care and new patients. Most practices experienced quite a backlog in the third quarter, but lighter and spotty schedules in the fourth quarter. Still, considering that most practices were closed for about two months, dental offices showed a strong recovery and have pretty good reason to hope for a decent, though probably not spectacular, 2021.

Another recent survey we did showed that dentists were reasonably optimistic about the coming year. 73% of dentists were positive or very positive about the possibilities for 2021.
